# COURSE AIMS AND CONTENT:

The aim of the lecture is to discuss principles of the methodology of economic sciences, to present the main problems of Polish and global economy, and to discuss approaches used by economists to analyze these problems.

# KNOWLEDGE TO BE ACQUIRED:

- 1. Economics as a science. Principles of economic methodology. Economics and other sciences. The importance of models in economics. Basic economic categories.
- 2. Basic market analysis, human needs and demand, determinants of demand, demand curve. Supply and determinants of supply. Supply and demand curves, the equilibrium price, the role of prices in the economy. A model of perfect competition.
- 3. Business entities: enterprises and households. Producer and consumer behavior on the market. Market analysis on the example of the food market. The effects of state intervention in markets.
- 4. The role of the state in a market economy. The economic system and the state policy. Market failure and government intervention. Public goods. The role of economic and administrative measures an example of environmental problems.
- 5. Basics of macroeconomic analysis. Gross Domestic Product and methods of GDP calculation. Macroeconomic policy of the state: fiscal and monetary policies. Growth and economic development. Determinants of economic growth and development, methods of measuring growth and development, growth models.
- 6. The world market and the global economic system. The phenomenon of economic globalization. Trade, financial and information interrelations in the global economy. Growing development distances in the modern world. The main threats to the economic development.
